
ARC research reveals significantly fewer primary care providers, medical specialists, and dentists in New York's Cortland and Chenango counties compared to other counties. Innovative Readiness Training's mission in 2019 in Appalachian New York involved performing 21,281 medical procedures (dental, optometry, veterinary, and other health services) valued at approximately \$1.2 million and serving 3,608 patients.

IMPACT ON DISTRESSED AREAS

ARC provided \$150,000 to Triple Cities Makerspace, Inc. in Binghamton for a workforce training program with high-tech manufacturers that includes outreach to schools serving distressed census tracts to provide ready workforce training and STEM education opportunities for underserved communities.

FISCAL YEAR 2019 OCTOBER 1, 2018-SEPTEMBER 30, 2019

In partnership with New York State Department of State, Division of Local Government Services, ARC is supporting **26 projects** in New York totaling almost \$4 million in fiscal year 2019. These investments have been matched by over \$6 million. They are also creating or retaining 22 jobs, training and educating more than 1,500 students and workers, and benefiting the one million residents in New York's 14 Appalachian counties.
