INVESTMENTS IN ACTION

With support from the ARC, the public wastewater collection system is being extended in Pocahontas County, West Virginia to provide new services to 110 households, 7 businesses, and 2 industrial customers. This project is eliminating the discharge of untreated wastewater and potentially attracting new manufacturing jobs and investments.

IMPACT ON DISTRESSED COUNTIES


In West Virginia, **15 counties** were considered economically distressed in fiscal year 2019, with pockets of distress in other areas. **38 projects** totaling **89%** of ARC investment

dollars are having a direct impact on these distressed counties and areas.

WEST VIRGINIA

Office, ARC is supporting 47 projects in West Virginia totaling over \$22.5 million in fiscal year 2019. These investments have been matched by \$36.3 million and are attracting an additional \$17 million in leveraged private investments in West Virginia. They are also creating or retaining nearly 1,900 jobs, training and educating over 4,000 students and workers, and benefiting the 1.8 million residents in West Virginia's 55 Appalachian counties.
