

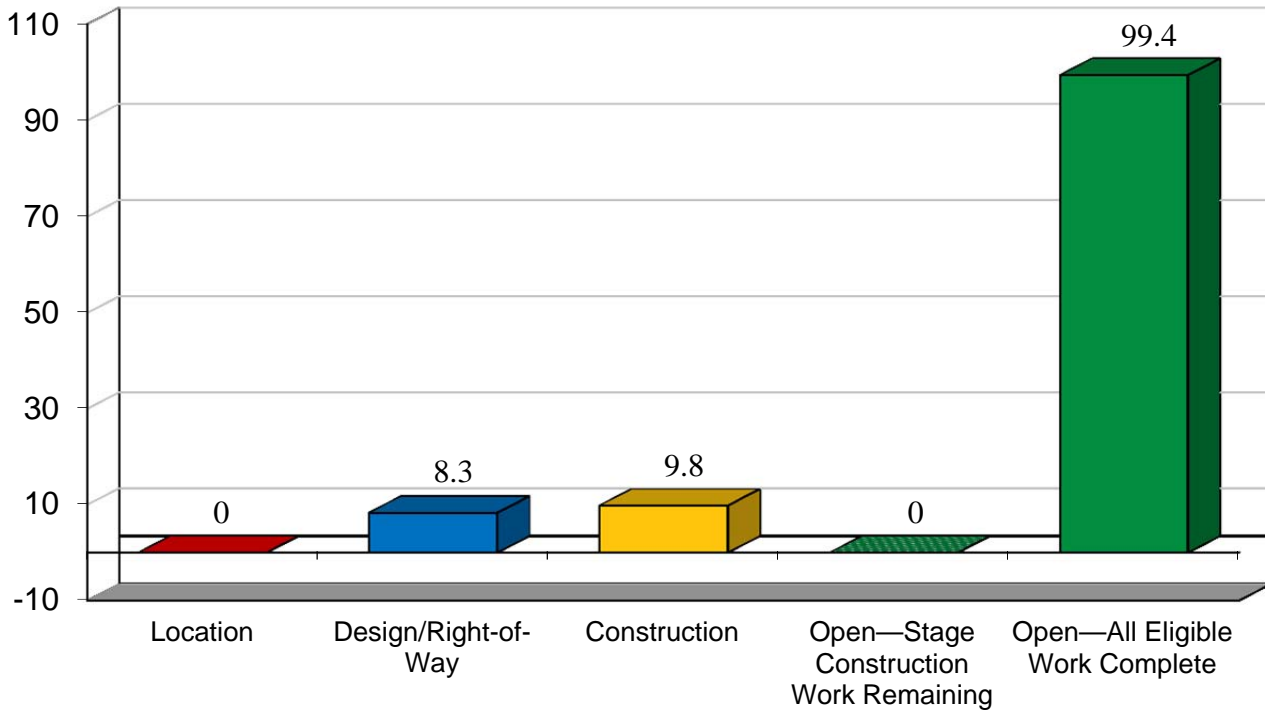
MISSISSIPPI 2012 ADHS COST-TO-COMPLETE ESTIMATE

Mississippi has two corridors on its 127.9-mile portion of the ADHS (including 10.4 miles of ineligible sections). Eligible ADHS mileage is 85 percent complete. The 2012 cost-to-complete estimate for Mississippi’s ADHS corridors is \$31.0 million.

Mississippi has \$7.3 million in federal funds available, including unobligated funds from the ADHS apportionments, earmarks under various highway appropriations acts (including TEA-21, ISTEA and SAFETEA-LU), and allocations under other appropriations acts.

Mississippi needs \$23.7 million to complete its portion of the ADHS.

Corridor X

Corridor X is complete. The corridor extends 9.1 miles from Corridor V to the Alabama state line.

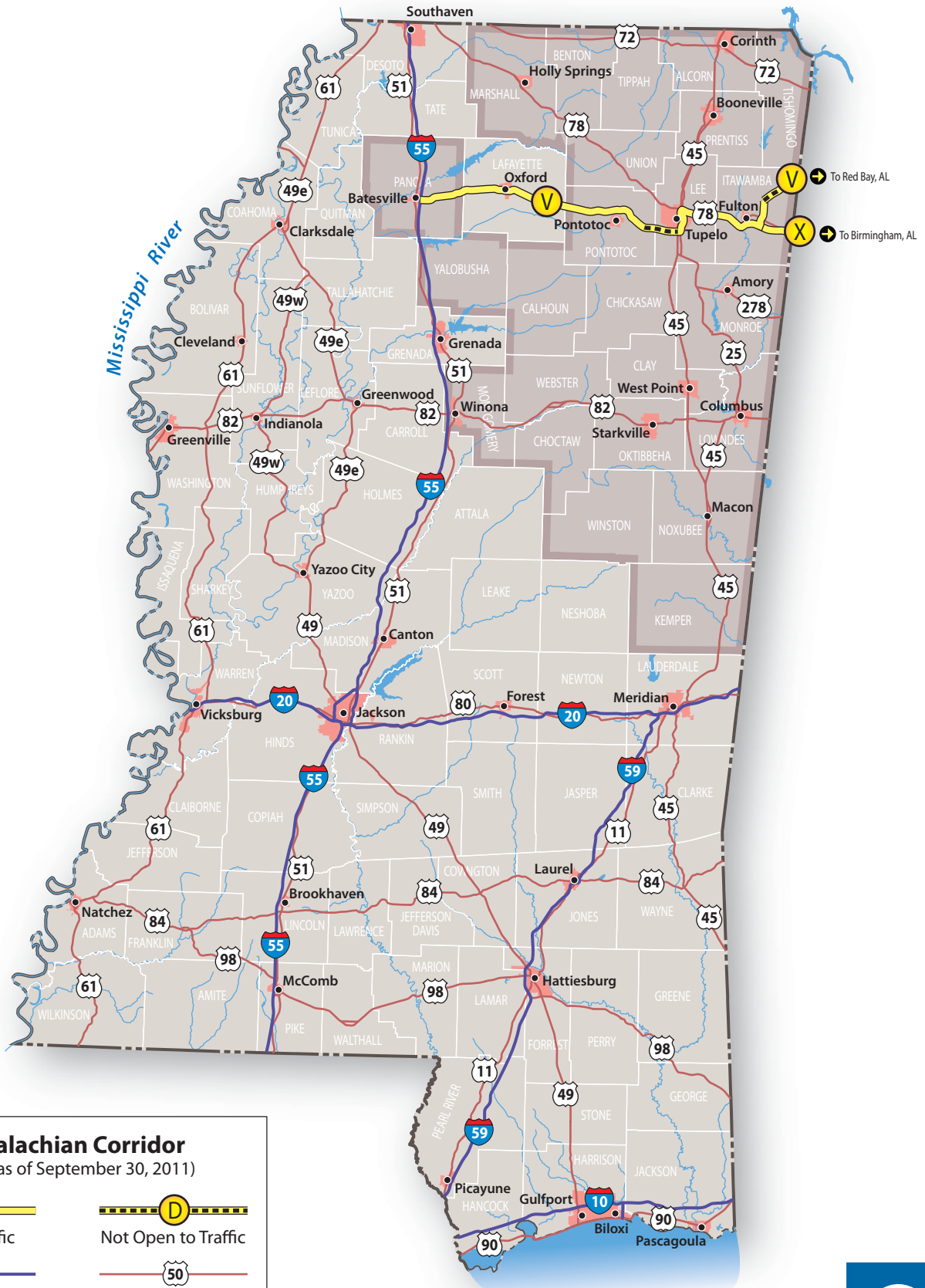
Corridor V

Corridor V extends 118.8 miles, including 17 miles of ineligible sections, from I-55 to the Alabama state line. The estimated cost to complete Mississippi’s portion of Corridor V is \$31.0 million.

Remaining work includes the construction of four lanes on the 9.8-mile section of SR 6 on a new location on the west and south side of Tupelo and for a 1.7-mile section of the 9.0-mile section on new location from SR 25 to the Alabama state line.
