
## 2012 ADHS COST-TO-COMPLETE ESTIMATE

South Carolina has one corridor on its 30.7-mile section of the ADHS, Corridor W, which includes 7.8 miles of adequate sections. Eligible mileage on Corridor W is 81percent complete. South Carolina has \$26.3 million in federal funds available, including unobligated funds from the ADHS apportionments, earmarks under various highway appropriations acts (including TEA-21, ISTEA and SAFETEA-LU), and allocations under other appropriations acts.

South Carolina has accrued adequate federal funding to complete its portion of the ADHS.

### **Corridor W**

Remaining work includes the addition of two lanes on a 4.3-mile section of US 25 in Greenville. South Carolina has completed 90 percent of this work. Right-of-way acquisition is complete and the last section of Corridor W is under construction.
